24 Hours Before Test

- Caffeine interferes with some of the medication used with the nuclear stress test and
 will cause it to give false results. Do not eat or drink any caffeine or decaffeinated
 products for 24 hours prior to the test (coffee, tea, coke, chocolate, etc). You may drink
 Sprite and Water.
- Some medications can also cause the test to give false results. If you take medications
 that contain THEOPHYLLINE, AGGRENOX, DYPRIDAMOLE, PERSANTINE, or CAFFEINE, do
 not take these medications for 48 hours prior to the test.

The Day of the Test

- Do not eat or drink after midnight the night before the test.
- Do not take medications known as beta-blockers the evening before or the morning of the test. These medications include: TOPROL XL, COREG, ATENOLOL, METOPROLOL, LOPRESSOR.
- If you are diabetic, do not take your diabetes pill or insulin the morning of the test.
- **Do not take your medicines the morning of the test.** Bring all of your medications with you to the hospital.
- Wear light comfortable clothes; the test could take up to 4 hours to complete.
- You may want to bring a book, or something that keeps you entertained.
- If you are unable to keep your appt *please call our office at least 24 hours before your test to cancel.* Medication for test is specially ordered for you.
